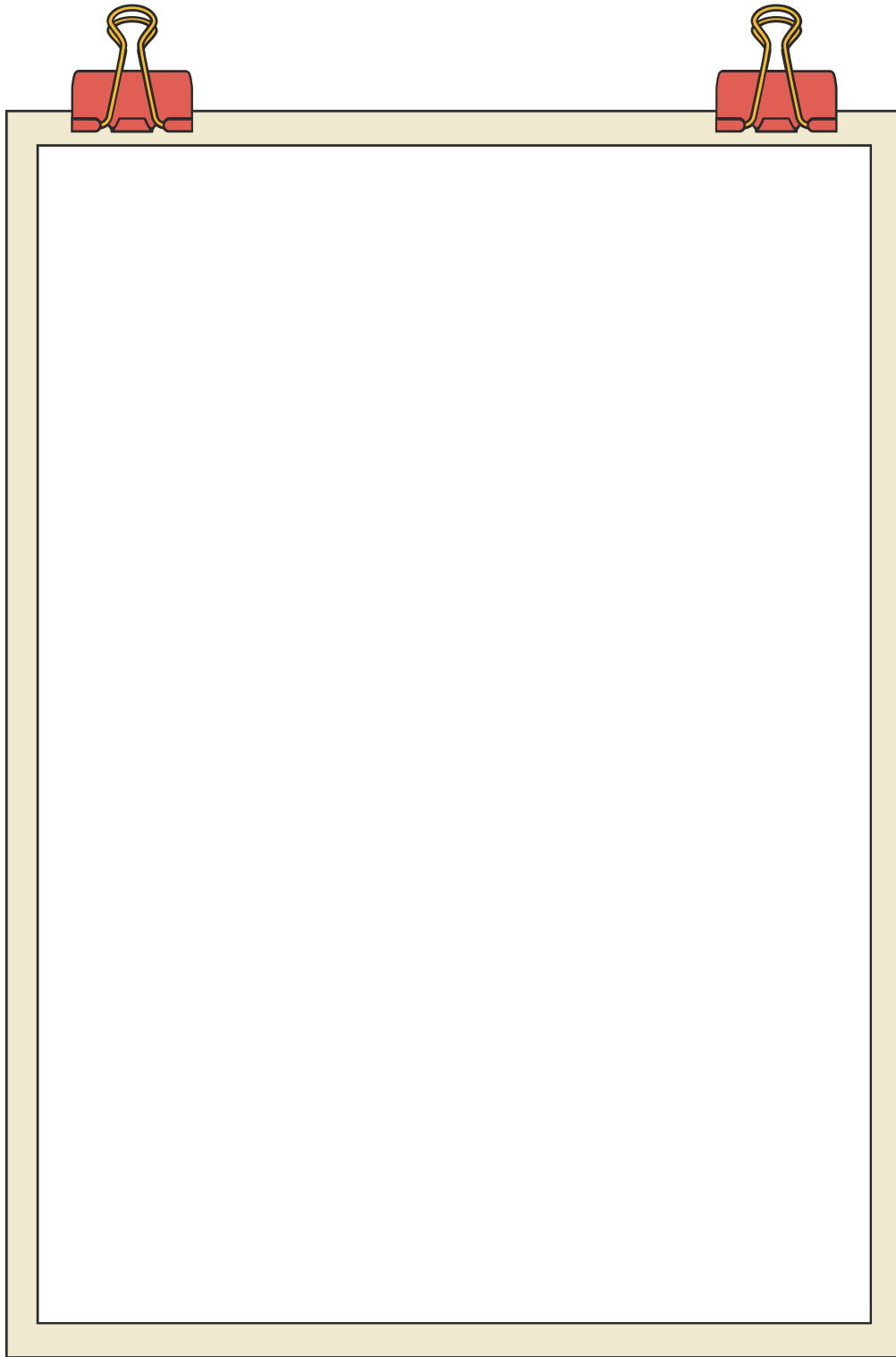


My Kindness Poster

Role play

Here are two new role-play scenarios you can integrate within the lesson for younger kids with links to Islamic teachings:

Scenario 1: Helping a Friend in Need

The Scene: A child trips and falls during playtime, dropping their belongings all over the floor.

Disrespectful Role Play:

Some children laugh and run away, ignoring the child who fell. The fallen child feels embarrassed and struggles to pick up their belongings.

Respectful Role Play:

One child notices the fallen friend and immediately offers to help them up.

Other children join in to gather the fallen belongings and make sure their friend is okay.

They comfort the child and invite them back to play.

Islamic Link:

Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said, "None of you [truly] believes until he loves for his brother what he loves for himself."

(Bukhari & Muslim)

This scenario highlights kindness and helping others, reflecting the values of compassion and unity.



Role play

Here are two new role-play scenarios you can integrate within the lesson for younger kids with links to Islamic teachings:

Scenario 2: Sharing Lunch

The Scene: A child forgets to bring their lunch and is sitting quietly, watching others eat.

Disrespectful Role Play:

The other children ignore the child without lunch, focusing on their own meals.

The child feels left out and hungry.

Respectful Role Play:

One child notices and offers to share some of their lunch.

Others join in, ensuring the child without lunch has enough to eat.

They make the child feel included and happy.

Islamic Link:

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said, "He is not a believer whose stomach is filled while his neighbour goes hungry."

(Sunan al-Kubra)

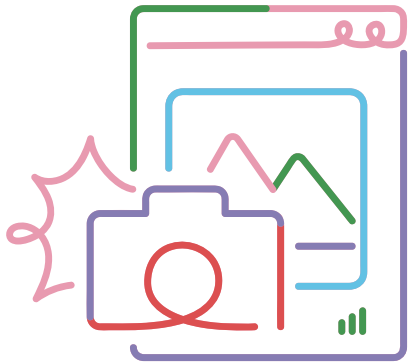
This scenario encourages generosity and emphasises the Islamic value of caring for others.



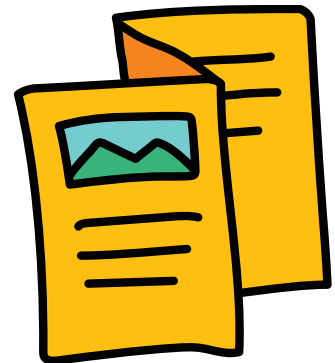
Arts & Crafts

Design a social media photo frame to promote Anti-Bullying Week.



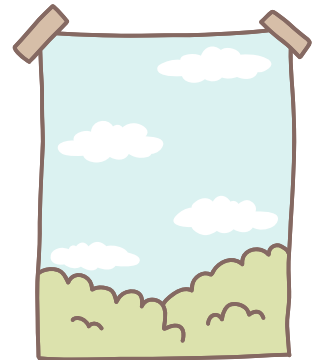
Create an informative leaflet discussing the differences between Banter and Bullying in Islam.

Creative writing piece

Activity Title: “Write a Letter to a Bully”

Prompt:

Imagine you see someone being bullied in your school. How would you stand up for them in a kind and respectful way? Write a letter to the bully explaining why bullying is wrong, using examples from Islamic teachings about kindness and respect.

Encourage the bully to change their behaviour by showing them how being kind can make everyone happier. End your letter by offering a way to work together to make the school a kinder place.

Optional Extension:

Students can also write a story about a character who learns to stop bullying and becomes a better friend by following Islamic values.

This activity helps kids ***practice empathy, critical thinking, and writing skills*** while reinforcing anti-bullying lessons.
